**JUNE 16, 2025**

The Keokuk County Board of Supervisors met in regular session, Monday, June 16, 2025, in the Board Room of the Courthouse. Present were Michael C. Hadley, Daryl Wood, Kevin Weber and Christy Bates, County Auditor.

8:30 a.m.- Meeting was called to order. Motion was made by Kevin Weber to approve the tentative agenda as submitted. Deke Wood seconded the motion. All ayes and motion carried. Present were: Casey Jarmes, News Review, Pie Reighard and Stratton Bond, Conservation and Trisha Lipski.

8:35 a.m. - Review and approval of previous board meeting minutes was held. Motion was made by Deke Wood to approve the minutes of June 9 & 12, 2025 as submitted. Kevin Weber seconded the motion. All ayes and motion carried.

8:45 a.m. – Meeting with Andy McGuire, Engineer, regarding Keokuk County Highway Department. Andy informed V45 project is progressing with compaction testing good. Midwest is the subcontractor doing the culvert work for DeLong Construction. The Iowa County Engineer’s Association submitted a bundled joint application to Competitive Highway Bridge Projects (CHBP) that has made it through the screening process. Keokuk County has two bridges in said application. Mariannette Miller-Meeks is once again supporting Keokuk County with the Community Project Fund grant to be used for the west half of Pigeon Road. Andy noted the newly purchased pups are working well for hauling rock.

9:05 a.m. – Review and possible approval of application for use of Courthouse grounds for July 3, 2025, Kiddie Parade was held. The City of Sigourney provided proof of insurance for said event. Motion was made by Deke Wood to approve the request for July 3, 2025 as submitted. Kevin Weber seconded the motion. All ayes and motion carried.

9:10 a.m. – Review and discussion on filling IT position was held. Mike asked the Board members for their opinion on said matter. Kevin Weber indicated he felt #1 of the second interview session stood out, would hit the ground running due to the county knowledge shown in his interview and would be more inclined to go after the vendors regarding what is or is not needed. Deke Wood responded he did not disagree, noting said individual is well qualified, although noted his concern regarding future unknowns and being locked in with a full-time employee. Deke also inquired if this position is exempt or non-exempt. Christy Bates replied this matter was recently reviewed with our human resources attorney indicating an IT Director is considered an exempt position and will follow up with documentation. Mike shared his initial thought was to go with an outside vendor for a lesser cost but that was not the case. Mike Hadley continued by stating he feels we should hire the best individual for said position and have are very fortunate to have a great suitable individual apply. Board consensus was to proceed to hire #1 of the second interview session and place on the June 19, 2025 special agenda as a formal action item. Deke reminded the interim provider, AEA, should be given notice of the decision.

9:25 a.m. - Various Board and Committee reports were held. Deke Wood attended RUSS, Crime Commission and KCED – RISE grant meetings. Mike Hadley attended a Semco meeting. Kevin Weber had no scheduled meetings last week.

9:30 a.m.- Discussion of old/new business and public comment was held. Pie Reighard, Conservation Director, stated the north side of deck pilings are driven, the frame will be started today, June 16th and Andy Snakenberg/ Snakenberg Welding is making the railing for this deck project at Belva Deer Lake. Pie noted this project is being funded with generated revenues, not tax dollars.

There being no further business, motion to adjourn was made by Mike Hadley. All ayes and the meeting adjourned at 9:45 a.m.

The Keokuk County Board of Supervisors adjourned to meet Thursday, June 19, 2025.
