The Buyer shall, within 30 days, file an application for transfer with the Recorder's Office in the county they reside.

## BUYER BEWARE – BEFORE YOU BUY

By taking some simple precautions and doing some research, buyers can prevent problems and meet their legal responsibilities. Call the Iowa DNR, your local County Recorder, or your local DNR Officer to check the registration history of the vehicle/vessel you are wanting to purchase for active liens and verification that it hasn't been reported stolen. This is done by providing the IA registration number and/or the HIN/VIN to one of the parties listed above. You might also check to make sure the person selling it is the owner and has authority to sell it. If the vehicle/vessel is being sold at auction, a website or even a garage sale, the proper paperwork is still required before it can be registered.

Casual Sales are NOT EXEMPT FROM SALES TAX: 7% Sales Tax is collected on the purchase price for in-state purchases and 6% Sales Tax is collected for out-of-state purchases
