

**BOARD MINUTES**  
**JULY 8, 2024**

The Keokuk County Board of Supervisors met in regular session, Monday, July 8, 2024, in the Board Room of the Courthouse. Present were: Michael C. Hadley, Daryl Wood, Fred Snakenberg and Christy Bates, Auditor.

8:30 a.m.- Meeting was called to order. Motion was made by Deke Wood to approve the agenda. Fred Snakenberg seconded the motion. All ayes and motion carried. Also present was Casey Jarnes, News-Review.

8:35 a.m. - Review and approval of previous board meeting minutes was held. Motion was made by Fred Snakenberg to approve the minutes for July 1, 2024 as submitted. Deke Wood seconded the motion. Mike Hadley abstained due to being absent from said meeting. Motion carried.

8:45 a.m. – Meeting with Andy McGuire, Engineer regarding the Keokuk County Highway Department was held. Update on the County Road V5G pavement project: currently working on shouldering with expectation to wrap up next week; transitions are ground; milling, painting lines, seeding and miscellaneous items yet to accomplish prior to total completion of project. Deke Wood received a call regarding water over the road in front of Audrey Eyer’s residence near Gibson, Iowa. Andy responded he feels it was a clogged culvert but has not yet been informed of the findings.

9:15 a.m.- Possible acknowledgement of personnel report for Jacob Adrian, Ranger Maintenance, full time, Conservation Department was held. Jacob began work on July 1, 2024. Motion was made by Deke Wood to acknowledge the personnel report as submitted. Fred Snakenberg seconded the motion. All ayes and motion carried.

9:20 a.m. – Review and possible approval of Memorandum of Understanding regarding reimbursement from the Mental Health Agency of Southeast Iowa (MHASEI) for County employees/occupancy/equipment was held. Christy Bates informed County Attorney Thompson reviewed said MOU. Motion was made by Fred Snakenberg to approve the MHASEI MOU as submitted. Deke Wood seconded the motion. All ayes and motion carried.

9:25 a.m. – Various Board and Committee reports were held. Fred Snakenberg participated in a SEIL meeting. Deke Wood and Jay Allison, 1015 Transit representatives, met with television reporters to clear up misinformation regarding veteran transportation. As of August 1, 2024, out of county rides will no longer be free to veterans due to the increased financial costs, although in county rides will continue to be covered for veterans. Mike Hadley had no scheduled meetings last week.

9:30 a.m.- Discussion of old/new business and public comment was held. Bates distributed an email from Robert Nazario regarding final decision and order from the Iowa Utilities Board (IUB) granting rights to Summit Carbon Solutions, LLC to build the liquid CO2 pipeline and a Bremer County Board of Supervisors resolution objecting to IUB’s authority to enact eminent domain authority within Bremer County for privately owned and operated Carbon Dioxide Pipelines.

There being no further business, motion to adjourn was made by Mike Hadley. All ayes and the meeting adjourned at 9:35 a.m.
